Dear Families,

As our 50th anniversary celebration reaches its conclusion the students will be stepping back in time to the songs and sounds of that era. They will be preparing for our fabulous 1950's Spring Concert to be held on Tuesday, June 1st and Wednesday, June 2nd.

In order to fairly divide the audience for the concerts and allow parents, grandparents and alumni to enjoy the concert, we have split the school alphabetically by Family Name. The concert schedule is as follows:

Tuesday, June 1st	9:00 AM	A to K Families ( <i>pink ticket</i> )
	12:30 PM	L to Z Families ( <i>green ticket</i> )
Wednesday, June 2nd	9:00 AM	L to Z Families ( <i>green ticket</i> )
	12:30 PM	A to K Families ( <i>pink ticket</i> )

Students will be given a Family Concert Ticket **Pink** or **Green**, depending on your family name (i.e. The Smith Family would receive 1 Green Ticket for the June 1st Concert at 12:30 PM and 1 ticket for the June 2nd Concert at 9:00 AM) These tickets are for you and any extended family that would like to attend. No extra tickets are needed. Tickets will be sent home the week before the concert with your child.



To make this concert even more of a celebration, I am asking that the students wear the following 'costumes' on concert days. Girls may wear either a poodle skirt or Capri pants (any color) , a plain light colored T-shirt top with no logo or printing on it, slip on school shoes, white Keds type sneaker or Converse All-star type sneaker and white ankle socks. The girls should wear their hair up in a ponytail tied with a scarf or ribbon.

Boys should wear jeans with the hem rolled up, belt, white T-shirt, school shoes or Converse type sneaker and white socks. The boys may wear their hair 'greased' back if they would like.



Please do not go out and buy a poodle skirt or Converse sneakers. I have talked to the students about this and we discussed at length about using what they already own.

Doors for the concert will open 15 minutes prior to the start of each concert.

One last note is that I ask everyone to be mindful of all the children when taking photographs. Your child may be very comfortable with you taking their picture but there are some children that will be very timid in front of a large room full of people. So please, for the safety and comfort of all the children, turn the flash off on your camera. There should be plenty of light to take pictures without it.
