The story of Martha and Mary is one of my favorite passages in the Gospels. In the larger, color version of the graphic above, Martha is giving Mary the LOOK. The LOOK with the rolling eyes that says, "REALLY ?!" And Mary sits there, ever so sweetly in her own little world with Jesus, unaware that Martha has any issue with her at all. The story often prompts the assigning of personality types A and B to the sisters. I think some of both dwells in most of us. We intend to take some time to pray, but we oversleep or we fall asleep or the phone rings or someone needs a ride or we need to finish up some work emails... Our days are filled with so many tasks and so many decisions, and we don't always have the option of "later" or of someone else to help us. Jesus does not want for us to burdened or anxious or worried about many things. He wants to be our "only one thing" and our "better part." Jesus constantly invites us to sit and listen to him, and to do so peacefully and quietly. May the less-scheduled days of summer afford us all many such opportunities.

Now, this may invite **the LOOK** and the **"REALLY?!**", but here goes... After a great deal of training and with a team of writers from both St. Francis and St. Clare, we have a pastoral plan for our collaborative. We will be sharing this with everyone and also seeking new volunteers to help with many aspects of this plan. Are you a doer or a listener? Comfortable with children or teens or adults or seniors? Facilitate or join a group or organize the hospitality? Welcome a newcomer to Mass or read God's word during Mass? Sing or play an instrument? Have office or computer skills? So when you have some time with our Lord, please listen for where he may be calling you to ministry. More later...

We call this Radical Hospitality, an attitude that many parishes are intentionally adopting. Every person in a pew should be a greeter, yes, even YOU. We are all called to welcome the stranger in our pews and reach out to assist the newcomer.
