Summertime is in full swing—many blessings to all.



The readings this week invite us to take a look at our faith. **What is faith?** The most simple definition, given by the *Merriam Webster's Learner's Dictionary*, has 3 elements:

A strong belief or trust in someone or something Belief in the existence of God, strong religious feelings or beliefs

A system of religious beliefs

What is faith? As Catholics, faith is all of the above, and more. My mom frequently says, "I don't know what I would do without my faith." It not only bookends her day-from her morning prayers to her night-time rosary, it is part of her every breath. She trusts that God is in charge, that God never tires of the prayers with which she storms heaven, and that God's will for her will be done, in God's time. What is faith? It's in the first sentence of today's reading from the Book of Wisdom: "The night of the passover was known beforehand to our fathers, that, with sure knowledge of the oaths in which they put their faith, they might have courage." The people of Israel put their faith in God's promises, and even though they had to wait a long and difficult time, they trusted in God's faithfulness to them. What is faith? Chapter 11 of the letter to the Hebrews begins: "Brothers and sisters: Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. Because of it the ancients were well attested." In today's passage, the writer uses the word "faith" five more times. The faith he describes is an active faith that feeds their desire for a better and heavenly homeland. What is faith? In Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples (us): "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom." And like the ancients, we put our faith, "our moneybags that do not wear out", our "inexhaustible treasure" that "no thief can reach" in this promise. Faith, hope (revisit today's psalm), trust, release from fear, and finally-preparedness. How ready ARE we? As Catholic Christians, we have been entrusted with much, with much more. Are we doing what is required of us, what is demanded of us? Let's take the time to polish our "inexhaustible treasure" so that we shine brightly and are ready and vigilant for the return of our Master.
