"This saying is trustworthy and deserves full acceptance:

Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners."

When Pope Francis proclaimed this the Year of Mercy, he desired to open our hearts to God's grace and mercy at work in our own lives AND to the people and circumstances we encounter that present us with the opportunity to show mercy. Today's readings illustrate this desire. In the Old Testament reading. God is set to let his wrath blaze up against the Israelites for their lack of faith and trust until Moses reminds God of the promises made to their ancestors; and in his mercy, God relents and the people are spared. In the New Testament, St. Paul writes to Timothy about his initial ignorance and unbelief, prior to his conversion; and twice he mentions that in spite of his sinfulness, he was "mercifully treated" by a faithful, loving, and patient Christ Jesus. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus himself illustrates in three separate parables the joy in heaven "over one sinner who repents." The action in the first two parables is passive—the sheep and the coin are "found." And sometimes, we may see ourselves in that passive mode. We stay lost—maybe because we're not quite ready to give up (whatever) and be found, maybe because we're in so deep that we see no way out. Let us pray for the grace to cooperate with God in God's plan of salvation—as agents of mercy to others and mindful of God's promises, of God's love, and of our responsibility to choose to journey back home, time and time again.


