"Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented." - Lk 16:25



From the desk of the Pastoral Associate Mrs. Linda Muldoon

In today's readings, we hear "woe to the complacent" from Amos the prophet; Psalm 146 describes the actions of the Lord that we are called to imitate; "to compete well for the faith" and "keep the commandment without stain or reproach" is called for in the 1st Letter to Timothy; and finally, Luke's Gospel description of the great chasm between the rich man and the poor man. Today, the Old Testament reading and the Gospel clearly go hand in hand. In the Daily Reflection of Creighton University's Online Ministries for the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Maureen McCann Waldron writes about a kinship into which Jesus invites us:

"Our world is too divided and often we isolate ourselves into Us and Them... We are challenged to see Jesus in each other and to recognize the sacred humanity that we share with every other person." She mentions a speaker who suggests that we regard each other with the phrase "one of us." It certainly provides a different perspective:

"One of us was shot on the streets last night. One of us did the shooting. One of us had our life changed by terrorism. Many of us were killed. Someone with whom I strongly disagree is as beloved by God as I am. One of us." She concludes:

"Today's readings invite me to look at the chasms I create in my own life, the false boundaries between Us and Them. Where do I fail to reach out to those who need me because of my own protectiveness of my time, my money or simply my own fears? Are there people in my own life or maybe beyond my daily life that I am being asked to tend to, to feed, or to forgive? On this 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we are summoned to close the artificial gap between Us and Them, between our own comfortable lives, and the sisters and brothers who need us – the ones we don't always see in pain on our own doorstep.

Safety has always been paramount at Saint Francis of Assisi School. We celebrate our identity by providing and ensuring a safe and healthy learning environment for our entire school community.

In our commitment to the process of enhancing the safety and security of our school community, our faculty and staff recently participated in a couple of trainings on lockdown procedures, as well as on utilizing the COPsync911 system.

COPsync911 is a revolutionary school safety tool providing a real-time threat alert and notification system. In the event of a threat, school administrators or faculty can activate CS911 by clicking on an icon — instantly sending an alert to the (5) closest law enforcement patrol cars (regardless of agency or jurisdiction) and dispatch.

The CS911 software platform provides a real-time chat window and allows faculty or staff to provide pertinent and reliable information via instant message to law enforcement. CS911 provides officers and dispatch with threat location (address and room number), GPS directions to the threat, and an interactive floor plan schematic of the school building — enabling officers to respond on scene faster with exact knowledge of the location of the threat.




