Did you know that we just wrapped up Fire Prevention Week? I have found now that we no longer have children in school who would be bringing home all kinds of related materials, it's easy to lose track—even as the daughter

of a firefighter. NO excuse regarding fire safety practices and smoke detectors would have been acceptable to him. Whether you live alone or with others, it's time to review what you would do in the event of a fire. The website listed below has some great information.

Did you also know that the National Fire Alarm Code requires that smoke detectors be replaced every 10 years? Because the public is generally unaware of this requirement, many homes likely have smoke alarms that are past their expiration date, putting people at increased risk in the event of a home fire. According to an NFPA report, in one-fifth (20 percent) of all U.S. homes with smoke alarms, the smoke alarms aren't working; three out of five home fire deaths result from fires in properties without smoke alarms (38 percent) or with no working smoke alarms (21 percent).

"People tend to assume that simply having smoke alarms in their home ensures adequate protection from fires, but it takes regular testing and maintenance to ensure that that's the case," said Carli. "Part of that effort is making sure you know how old the smoke alarms in your home are, and that they're replaced every 10 years." Carli notes that the age of a smoke alarm can be determined by looking for the date of manufacture on the back or side of the alarm, and to replace the units 10 years from that date.

NFPA has been the official sponsor of Fire Prevention Week for more than 90 years. For more information on this year's campaign, "Don't Wait: Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years," visit www.firepreventionweek.org.

Not sure about you—but I always thought we were safe because we conscientiously used Fire Safety Week as our reminder to change the batteries in our smoke alarms. This article has place a new item at the top of my to-do list. Please—Don't Wait—Check the Date!

Upcoming Social Studies Field Trips

On Tuesday, October 18th, the eighth grade students from Quincy Catholic Academy, St. Paul, St. Jerome, Sacred Heart and St. Francis of Assisi Schools will participate in a collaborative field trip to the Edward M. 
