My brothers and sisters.

"Remember , O man, that thou art dust and unto dust thou shalt return."

This formula for the distribution of ashes on Ash Wednesday is a stark but healthy reminder that our lives—and the length of them—are not our own. We belong to God. As St. Paul teaches, *None of us lives for oneself and none of us dies for oneself. When we live we live for the Lord and when we die we die as His servants. Both in life and death, then we are the Lord's.*

This truth can sober us but also should provide great consolation. During the month of November the Church takes its cue from the gathering of the harvest and meditates on God gathering in the souls of the dead into heaven. This past week began with All Saints' and All Souls' Day (on Tuesday and Wednesday).

Our next commemorators are the Parish Masses of Remembrance to be held tonight (Sunday) at St. Clare's (at 6:00PM) and next Saturday (11/12 at 12 Noon) at St. Francis. Each year we remember those for whom we have provided funeral services over the past year. We invite their family members and friends to come together to pray for their loved one(s) and reaffirm our belief in eternal life and our hope for a blessed resurrection. Here the concluding words of the Nicene Creed come home to us with special force, meaning and beauty.

"I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen." Requiescant in pace!

May they rest in peace!

All parishioners are welcome and encouraged to attend these Masses. After each, a meal is served. Once the bereaved families have been served, you would also be welcome to join in the meal, assuming there is enough for all.

My very special thanks to Marta Googins (Fasano's Catering) and Carlo and Irene Barone (Carlo's Cucina Italiana) for their support in helping us provide a meal and celebrate the joy of the harvest while we entrust our loved ones to the Lord of the Harvest.

- **Grains of salt** symbolize the tears of waiting families.
- Empty chair represents the missing soldiers.
- A **turned over glass** stands for the meal that won't be eaten.
- The **black napkin** signifies the sorrow of captivity.
- A **red rose** represents the hope that all missing soldiers will return.
