
#### From the desk of the Pastoral Associate Mrs. Linda Muldoon



The Third Sunday of Advent readings speak to us of prophecy and of fulfillment. The beauty and poetry of Isaiah prophecy what will happen when our saving God comes to bring new life to his people—a message of hope and of trust.

In Matthew's Gospel, to the followers of John the Baptist, Jesus reveals the fulfillment of the prophecy by his own saving words and deeds. Fast forward to the 21st century, and God's people still seek healing and wholeness, help and salvation—physical, emotional, and spiritual. We await that final coming of Jesus, the coming that the writers of the New Testament believed to be so imminent. Pope Francis writes: "The gift of faith we receive (at baptism) allows us to love God without ever having seen him. Our belief in the salvation promised us is what drives us to live in hope and to be witnesses of Christ's presence among us. Joy is a sign of that presence. It is a mark of a Christian. Love and joy are fruits of the Holy Spirit. Love and joy also help sustain us through difficult times as we work to attain the goal of our faith, the salvation of our souls." On this Gaudete Sunday, let us light the rose-colored candle and rejoice in the Lord-always!

## A St. Vincent DePaul Reflection for December 11: Third Sunday of Advent

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us that the good news can be seen, touched, felt and heard through the lives of God's people. We are now charged to take up the ministry of

Jesus, but we can't just ask people to take our word for it; our actions must speak for us. Since Christmas is a time of love and gift giving, we thank you for sharing in the ministry of Jesus by the many generous gifts our Society of St. Vincent de Paul has received this Advent—so that those who are poor can know the good news of Jesus.



Our Advent Giving Tree concludes THIS Weekend. You can help provide gifts for families, who are unable to purchase even essentials for Christmas gifts, in any of the following ways.

- 1) Take a tag from the tree and purchase a requested item.
  - \* If you take a tag from the tree, please look at it before you leave church to be certain that you are willing and able to purchase at least some of the gifts listed there. If not—simply return it to the tree and take a different card that more suits your mindset and your budget. If someone has listed a basketball, please do not substitute a board game. (Seriously—this happens!)
  - \* Please check to see if the organization sponsoring the card has requested that you wrap the gift(s). If the tag says do not wrap, you can still help everyone involved in sorting and organizing by placing your purchase in a gift bag so that our volunteers can easily check the contents.
  - Please securely attach the tag you take from the tree to the outside of the bag or package. The tags are coded by color and number and we need them back so that your gift reaches the correct organization and recipient.
  - \* All gifts should be returned (left under the tree) **no** later than December 11.
- 2) If you are unable to shop, you can make a monetary donation [do not take a tag] and members of the Christian Service Commission will do the shopping and wrapping for you. You may place your donation in the collection basket in an envelope marked "Advent Giving Tree Program." Checks should be made payable to St. Francis of Assisi with "Giving Tree" on the Memo line.




