2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The readings of the Advent and Christmas seasons were filled with references to light—the Sun of Justice and the Star of Bethlehem are a couple that come to mind. Now here we are at the beginning of Ordinary Time, and the theme of light continues. Today's reading from Isaiah ends with God telling his servant, Israel, "I will make you a light to the nations that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth." God tells you and me the very same thing; by virtue of our baptism, we, too, have been made... lights! And immediately following those words, we proclaim the psalm response: "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will." Let us do God's will, let us spread the light, giving witness to the world of God's majesty and mercy, by our service and worship of the God who made us and calls us by name.



A couple of weeks ago, you may have read about our need for some "real time" help in several areas of parish life and ministry. Most of the help we are looking for depends on your presence here with us for a designated hour or two a month-a night-time Panera pick-up, a morning at the food pantry, a shift as a sacristan. And now this week a volunteer brought to my attention that we need the kind of help you can give while staying home! We are looking for folks who are willing to collect and launder (at home) the linens used during Mass, and then return them. After pretreating, this would be one washing machine/dryer small purificators-think of whites (mostly load large handkerchiefs) that are then steam-pressed and folded. For those who find ironing relaxing, this is ideal; and for those who hate ironing, this is easy! At the moment, there are 6 people on the schedule, meaning this is no more than a once monthly arrangement. 


