

Today's Gospel presents with a shorter and longer form, and the selection rests with the celebrant of the Mass. So you may or may not hear the 2nd scene from St. Matthew. In the hope that you do, or that you look at Matthew 4:12-23, here are a couple of thoughts from an interesting reflection I read this week. Please note that the words in parentheses are my inserts. In the passage, Jesus calls first Peter and Andrew and then James and John to follow him. All four respond immediately, leaving behind nets, boat, and father. The author of the reflection posits that our nets are what we (think we) control; our boat allows us (freedom) to come and go as we please; and our father might be the family history (self-identity) we carry within ourselves. If Jesus were to summon us from all that is familiar (right here in Braintree...), could we immediately leave it behind? The final sharing question that follows the reflection is, "What things do we have to (can we) give up and walk away from in order to approach and possess them anew?"



In this Sunday's Gospel, we find that Jesus "... proclaimed the good news of the kingdom and cured the people of every disease and illness." Your gift to the Society of St. Vincent DePaul proclaims the food news of Jesus to those who are

suffering.


Parish Info and events of note



January 22 ~ Third Sunday in Ordinary Time
