Today is the 1st Sunday in Lent; and in the Gospel, Matthew writes: "At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry."

Here we are are—four days and four nights into Lent. What about our fasting? How hungry are we? It is ingrained in many of us to "give up something for Lent." Our typical "sacrifices" of a favorite food or beverage, a TV show or time on-line are useful if our hunger for them somehow draws us closer to God so that it is the Lord for whom we hunger. Or... we can fast from behaviors that cause fault lines in our relationships with God and with each other--impatience, dishonesty, selfishness, disrespect, avoidance, harsh words, etc. If only there was a "hold" button for what too quickly flows out of us! Or... we can do more, and we can give more with one loving, kind, generous gesture at a time. This Lent, let us hunger for God and for all that leads us closer to him. Today Jesus himself encourages us as he rebukes the devil:

"It is written: One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God." "Again it is written: You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test."

"It is written: The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve."

Also this Lent, we have available to us free copies of *The Little Black Book for Lent*. Although small enough to fit in a pocket or a purse, this book can have a big impact on living Lent, day to day. Please take one home today! As in the past, Creighton University has many resources for Lent. I just spent some time on their site, and found a Daily Prayer option that includes Scripture, prayer, and petitions. Visit www.onlineministries.creighton.edu to find the ones that speak to you. If you can make (or have) some space in your schedule for a daytime or evening presentation, consider looking at Miramar Retreat Center in Duxbury www.miramarretreat.org or Glastonbury Abbey in Hingham www.glastonburyabbey.org.





March 5 ~ First Sunday of Lent

Jesus was like us in all things but sin. He was tempted, sorely tempted, over and over. This first Sunday in Lent might be a good time to take account of the things in our lives that tempt us away from God and from the light of Christ. Like New Year's resolutions, Lent is a time to look at what needs improvement in our relationship with God. The three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It's not about fasting to lose 10 pounds, it's fasting to build up strength to resist temptation. A common practice in Lent is to give up something we like - a latte, not Brussel sprouts and putting that money in a mission box or your St. Vincent de Paul box. Make this Lent a good one. Also, pray, today, for the hundreds of catechumens and candidates in our archdiocese who are entering the next stage of preparation to receive Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist or to be received into the Catholic Church.
