### From the desk of the Pastoral Associate Mrs. Linda Muldoon



Today is the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Lent, just about the midpoint--already. In the heat of the mid-day sun, Jesus waits by the well for his

disciples who had gone into town to buy food. He also waits for someone else. Commentaries on this Gospel passage suggest that the Samaritan woman approached the well at noontime so as not to be seen by anyone else. We might say, "She had a lot of baggage." And this stranger, this Jew, says to her, "Give me a drink." Suddenly, it is about so much more than a cool drink on a hot day. Jesus talks with her about living water, her past, where and how and whom to worship, and even reveals his identity. The disciples return, and the woman goes into town to summon the very people she'd been avoiding. Curiosity piqued, they go to the well, they go to Jesus; and they believe—not because of the woman but because of what they heard for themselves.

Where does Jesus wait for us? As we toss and turn, unable to fall asleep? On the youth baseball field as the game drags on and we have so much else to do? In the folks we fear who are not quite like us? In the doctor's office? At the Registry of Motor Vehicles? At our collaborative retreat? At Bible Study? In confession? At Mass? Wherever we are—right now?

"Give me a drink." That's the opening line for today. Let us pray with it. Let those words be followed by: Give me your attention. Give me a moment of your time. Give me your heart. Give me that baggage. Let me show you what I have been waiting to give to you. My well is bottomless; share what you receive.

The Little Black Book for Lent... It's not too late to begin! Although small enough to fit in a pocket or a purse, this book can have a big impact on living Lent, day to day. Please look on the tables by the doors to the church and take one home today! We also continue to recommend the many resources available through Creighton University. I just spent some time on their site and read some transcripts of Lenten Audio Conversations. Food for thought...
