

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

In the Old Testament reading from the prophet Ezekiel, it is the LORD who says, "O my people, I will open your graves and have you rise from them." In the Gospel from John, Jesus, having wept at the death of his friend Lazarus, is not quite so poetic when he calls him forth from his tomb with a rousing, "Lazarus, come out!" This is a multi-layered piece of scripture that beautifully lends itself to experiential prayer before we begin our Holy Week observances. Are you one of the disciples, questioning Jesus' decision to return to Bethany but choosing to accompany him to see what will happen? Are you Martha or Mary, sisters of the dead man, who each call out Jesus for not having arrived sooner, AND who in spite of her (Martha) sorrow makes a stunning profession of faith? Are you an anonymous member of the crowd that follows Jesus to the tomb, not sure if you believe but curious to see what he will do there? Are you Lazarus, all bound up and dead to the world? Or maybe you are Jesus, with the intent of revealing the glory of God through your words and actions. During Lent, we are called to go deep into our "caves" and ask God to show us the things of this world that bind us and blind us from living as true disciples. God does not love us less for these things but waits for us to ask his help in discarding them so that we, too, can live as children of the light and be well-prepared to participate in the liturgies of Holy Week and the glory of Easter.

The Little Black Book for Lent can still be a valuable part of your Lenten journey. Although small enough to fit in a pocket or a purse, this book can have a big impact on living Lent, day to day. Please look on the tables by the doors to the church and take one home today! We also continue to recommend the many resources available through Creighton University. Visit www.onlineministries.creighton.edu to see what may appeal to you.
