The Holy Week 2017 Magnificat contains a reflection on Palm Sunday written in the seventeenth century by St. Francis de Sales. In it, he describes three qualities found in the simple

beast of burden, the ass, requested by Jesus for his entrance into Jerusalem. Humility. Patience. Obedience. We see that Jesus himself embodies these attributes in the events that unfold in today's gospel and passion narrative from Matthew and in the Holy Week readings. Jesus tells his apostles, Jesus tells us on Holy Thursday: "I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do."

For most of us, that model given by Jesus is a challenge. Holy Week gives us the opportunity to reflect on the life and times, the passion and death of Jesus Christ. It also provides us with a lens to reflect on our lives, to look back a little, but mostly to look forward—with renewed humility, patience, and obedience—to the glory of Christ's Resurrection and to the redemption and renewal that his Paschal Sacrifice offers to all of us.







On Good Friday – good because it is the day we were redeemed - when we sing "Were You There" will you be able to say, Yes, Lord, I walked – and will continue to walk - with you?
