

The Second Sunday of Easter—"Blessed are they who have not seen me, but still believe!"

"Doubting Thomas." "Seeing is believing." Our language contains many nuggets like these with origin in Sacred Scripture. Fast forward 2,000+ years to our world of information overload, of "fake news" and "fact checkers." The truth is often elusive, complicated and multi-layered. What I believe to be true may not be the same as what you believe to be true. When it comes to our faith, most of us can claim an advantage over Thomas. For him, it was all new and happening so quickly. You and I have the benefit of years of faith formation within our families and parishes, along with the examples and the writings of many holy men and women. We have our Bibles and our catechisms and our sacramentals. And—we have our sacraments. These outward signs of God's grace through which we become the recipients of God's grace offer us the opportunity for a personal encounter with Jesus Christ, our risen Lord. Each time we receive the Eucharist, the body and blood of Christ, we touch the Lord, as did Thomas. Each time we go to confession, we bring our faults, our failings, our doubts before the Lord, and he touches us with his mercy. Steadfast in faith or conflicted or searching, Jesus knows our hearts and loves us all. On this Divine Mercy Sunday and always, may we trust in him, and may his "Peace be with you."




