The 4th Sunday of Easter and Good Shepherd Sunday and World Day of Prayer for Vocations

Today's readings are both comforting and challenging. So many of us pray Psalm 23 with the image of the Good Shepherd burned into our hearts—leading us, guiding us, refreshing us, anointing us—giving us repose and courage. Breathe in, breathe out, shoulders down... Our Good Shepherd calls each one of us by name, but the choice to follow or not is ours to make. Yes, there is that verdant pasture, but there also are dark valleys along the way. In the dark places, it can be challenging to trust and to remember Who remains at our side. It can be challenging to sort through all the "voices" that call out to us, to all the "paths" that are available to us. Let us listen with our hearts for the voice that calls out to us with love. And then there's Peter, raising his voice and proclaiming Jesus as Lord and Christ, calling the people to repentance and baptism. As we pray for vocations today, we of course pray for priests, that many will respond to God's call and use their voices, their preaching skills, to proclaim Jesus. But what about us, in our vocations as single or married folks? When is the last time our voice was heard above the crowd in our daily lives proclaiming the Good News?


