

### The 7th Sunday of Easter

I'm thinking about the apostles. Even though three of them had witnessed the Transfiguration of Jesus, many had witnessed his passion and death, and most had spent some time with him after his Resurrection, it must have been incredibly difficult to wrap their brains and hearts around the fact that "he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight." So after Jesus left them for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time, they followed his directive and remained in Jerusalem, in "the upper room where they were staying," and waited for "the promise of the Father... the Holy Spirit." There they "devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary, the mother of Jesus, and his brothers." And now I'm thinking about the scenes from Manchester, England, where we stand with the men, women, and children of many different faiths in an attempt to wrap our brains and hearts around not the act of terror, but in love and solidarity around the victims and the survivors. We, too, are the survivors; and we, too, gather and "devote ourselves with one accord to prayer." As people of faith and people of peace, we are stronger than our differences, certainly stronger than the evil we have witnessed, and strongest in our resolve that Light will prevail over darkness.

### IT TAKES A PARISH TO CELEBRATE A LITURGY

When we plan a special event with families, friends or coworkers, there are countless details to which we attend. For Catholic Christians, MASS is THE SPECIAL EVENT, with many details contributing to the beauty of our liturgy, our public act of worship.

Did you ever wonder ho many people are involved in the preparation for, celebration of, and cleaning up after...a Mass?

At each Mass, we participate along with the priest celebrant, the altar server(s), the lector, and the extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist. For the Sunday Masses, the organist, cantors, choir, and folk group encourage everyone gathered to sing along with them. The ushers say hello, help us find seats, and pass the collection basket. At St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi, all of this comes together, day after day, week after week.

### But for it to happen:

The pastor creates a schedule for our priests. Other staff and volunteers not only schedule but also recruit and train the altar servers, the lectors, and the EMHCs. With the Director of Music, the cantors and choir select and practice the music and songs for each Mass; and the folk group does the same. Some of our ushers have been "regulars" at the same Mass—for years!

Seldom seen but always appreciated are volunteers who carefully launder the linens used at each Mass, the sacristans who arrive early and stay late to assist with set-up and clean-up the folks who give the church an occasional extra cleaning, and those who help arrange and maintain our seasonal flowers. In the weeks to come, you will have an opportunity to learn more about how it takes a parish to celebrate a liturgy and to "meet" some of the volunteers whose efforts help make every Mass a special event. We invite you to sit up and take notice and to prayerfully consider sharing some of your time and talent with our parish family.
