

Pentecost Sunday

Knowledge, Fortitude, Understanding, Piety, Counsel, Wisdom, Fear of the Lord

May the gifts of the Holy Spirit fill you with joy and enrich your life and the lives of those with whom you share them!



Last weekend, my husband and I watched the movie, Patriot's Day. The film and the act of terrorism in Manchester, England, brought back many memories of that April day and its aftermath. One that has never left me is a heightened awareness of my surroundings. This past Sunday, we attended Mass at St. Francis, entering church (with many others) just in time for the opening hymn. We shared a pew with someone I know from the parish. My husband was to my left, and this person toward the other end of the pew to my right. Seemingly out of nowhere, a good-sized cooler appeared on the bench between us. It was not there when we arrived, and I had not noticed the person next to me bringing it in. Could the person behind me have placed it there? WHERE did it come from? WHAT was in it, and WHY was it there? WHO, if anyone, was behind me? What to do? As we stood for the Gospel, I turned around, immediately recognized the family seated there, and asked if it belonged to them. No-absolutely not. Finally, I asked the person next to me, who claimed ownership and placed it under the bench. Let me tell you, my heart was pounding, and I KNEW the people around me! So please—be vigilant!

And that leads to the 2nd reason for this column. After one of the holy day Masses, a parishioner spoke with me about the large number of handbags she noticed in the pews while their owners went to communion. So on Sunday, I checked while in the communion line. She was right! There were many purses left behind. Especially concerning were the ones at the end of the pews and in the last row of the front section and first row of the back section. Although we all want to believe that no one in church would do such a thing, it has happened elsewhere. Let's not be easy marks or tempt fate—please take your handbags with you or place them so that they are difficult for anyone else to reach. Thank you.

If the words above do not resonate with you, please pass them along to someone you know who may be interested. God works through us, especially when we pay attention.


