My brothers and sisters,

It's "Summertime and the livin' is easy."

A few thoughts as we move into this Season. My prayer is also that in your house it may also be "Summertime and the livin' is holy".

CHURCH PARTICIPATION: God doesn't take vacations. All Catholics are obliged to attend Mass every Sunday and Holyday of Obligation (illness and/or danger of death are the only exceptions). I recommend www.masstimes.org as a good portal for church information if you are traveling. Warning: use this website to get contact info for the church and call to confirm what is listed. The Holyday that falls in Summer is the Solemnity of the Assumption—August 15. We will run our usual schedule here: **Monday, August 14** 4PM, St. Clare and 5PM, St. Francis. **Tuesday, August 15** 9AM and 5:30PM St. Clare and 7AM and 12:10 Noon, St. Francis.

We usually focus on Lent as the time to repair/heal/strengthen our relationship with God and the Church. To be practical, however, Summer schedules usually allow more time to do so than February, March and April. We are always happy to walk with you on that journey. Feel free to reach out to Deacon Joe, myself, Fr. Delay, Linda Muldoon, Fr. Bob, Deacon Mike, Ronna Petrilli, Diane Hopkins, or our SMA priest. We're happy to listen and, if appropriate, to share with you what we have from God as Pastoral Staff members.

The Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is helpful here too. All Catholics are obliged to confess all mortal sins in kind and number annually. That's the minimum. I suggest that it's actually easier to go 4 times per year than it is to go once. We priests are happy to accommodate our schedules to make it easier for individuals or families to come to confession. The regular times for celebration of this sacrament are on Saturdays: 8:30-9AM, St. Clare and 2:30-3:45PM, St. Francis.

CHURCH FINANCIAL SUPPORT: Many people go away in Summer. I trust you to do what you can to support us as your primary home of faith even through the Summer. The church(es) where you attend while away are also deserving of your support. Please pray and then do your best to be generous. We're grateful for your support.

May this beautiful season bring many blessings to you and those you love. Know that you are always in our thoughts and prayers here at the Collaborative parishes.

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells us, He promises us: "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father." I find it striking that within the same passage Jesus also tells us

three times to "fear not", to "be not afraid." And yet, in our very secular world, many are afraid to acknowledge before others our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Yes, men and women have died for doing just that, but within the realms of our existence, I daresay that is not at the top of the fear list for us. What is it then? Do we feel not worthy? Do we worry we might get it wrong? Is it counter to the selfsufficiency and individualism of New Englanders or East Coasters? Will we be thought less of for trusting in and loving a Power greater than ourselves, for walking by faith, not by sight? By acknowledging Jesus, do we disavow other things or habits we may have embraced? Perhaps we do acknowledge Jesus in the silence of our hearts but struggle with getting out the words and the actions that do so. Our faith is a precious gift from God, given to us to share with others. One of the greatest ways we do just that is by our presence at Mass. BUT when Mass concludes, the priest or deacon dismisses us with the words, "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord," or "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life."

It Takes a Parish to Prepare for and Celebrate the Sacraments

Do you remember the definition of the word "sacrament"? In user friendly terms, "The seven sacraments are outward signs and celebrations of God's love and life, or grace." At any given time, someone within our collaborative

is preparing for a sacrament! It may be the baptism of a baby, the First Eucharist of a child, the Confirmation of a teen, a first Confession or a 101st for someone heavily burdened, the Anointing of the Sick, a couple preparing for Marriage, someone discerning the call to Holy Orders, or an adult in the RCIA program anticipating full initiation into the Catholic Church. At any time, someone within our collaborative may benefit from your faith, your experience, and your wisdom!

"How so?" you may ask. If you are a young parent with children who have been baptized, you know it may not have been easy to accomplish that. You also know that it is not always easy to live out the baptismal promises made for us or by us. If you are reading this, you may have found a way! You may have found a way to model a Christian lifestyle, to talk about Jesus with your children, to pray with your spouse, to sometimes even bring your family to Mass. Maybe you'd be willing to share what works for you with other parents.

Maybe you're about to enroll your child in our 2 year religious education program that leads to 1st Holy Communion in grade 2. You will have lots of help and encouragement along the way from Debbie Clancy, Diane Hopkins, and Ronna Petrilli—our religious education coordinators. Maybe you'll be moved to help them by volunteering to teach a class. Or maybe your child is a teen who has chosen to be confirmed, and together you try to balance grade 9 & 10 religious education, school, and sports. Some folks are terrified by a group of 7 year-olds but relate well to a group of teenagers, again with lots of support and encouragement from our coordinators! Perhaps you are more comfortable with the later elementary grades or the middle schoolers. By our own Confirmation, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit that then help us to bring forth its fruits. Please pray and think about what gifts, what fruits you may be ready to share!

As we did last year, we would like to share our experiences working with the children and families of our parish. We had many moments that made us laugh and a few that brought us to tears, moments that made us hold our breath in anticipation as well as moments that took our breath away in awe. We witnessed growth among some and resistance from others...either way we witnessed movement. It has been our joy to sit and reflect on time spent with you, our precious families. Together we walked with you and every once in a while someone stopped and pointed toward Christ. We thank you all for these moments and the reminder to praise God for each other and all we have been given.

We shared "by adoption" a class this year that was difficult to say the least. The students in this class were very challenging (mostly behavioral). Since these youngsters came and showed no reserve (in behavior), we really got to know them as individuals. They stretched our imaginations in figuring out ways to keep them on track and motivated. They certainly strengthened our patience. These intelligent students started asking the tough questions that made us think and research. We quickly realized it would be unfair to simply answer their questions by offering a little history, some watered down doctrine and a weak dismissal..."It's a mystery." These kids really wanted to KNOW. They wanted to understand how God revealed himself (in Jesus) and continues to reveal himself (through us and others.) The challenge was on.... We think they taught us as much, if not more than we taught them!

"Jesus would say: If you love only those who study or who are well-educated, what merit does that have? There are those who try your patience, but we have to love them even more," In addition to teaching "the contents" of a particular subject, teachers need to build an edifying relationship with all students, "who must feel welcomed and loved for who they are, with all their limits and potential."- Pope Francis

Together we thank our "adopted" class of youngsters for adding an abundance of gifts; curiosity, determination, and energy (mostly energy) to our wrinkles and grey hair. They revealed themselves as individuals. What gifts! We welcome all gifts!


