This coming Saturday, July 22, is the feast day of St. Mary Magdalene. This Mary is known as the apostle to the Apostles, as a witness to the death of Jesus, and as THE first public witness to the Risen Christ. Pope Francis calls Mary of Magdala the "apostle of the new and greatest hope," noting that her

example is one of hope, and that her intercession helps us to live the experience of the Resurrection, because "at the time of tears and abandonment, she hears the Risen Jesus who calls us by name, and with a heart full of joy goes to announce: I have seen the Lord!" Such is Mary's importance to the Church, to all of us, that in June of 2016, Pope Francis, by decree, elevated her "Memorial", celebrated every July 22, to a "Feast," putting her on a par with the apostles. In God's great desire for personal relationship, Jesus calls each one of us by name, but in the busyness of our lives, we often miss the moments when he does so. Jesus also stands before us and with us, but in the busyness of our lives, we often miss the moments when he does so. In the stillness of the early morning, in the silence of the night, in unanticipated joy, in deep sorrow, and in the ordinariness of our lives, Jesus calls us by name and stands with us. Let us listen for and look for him, and let us help others to know Jesus by proclaiming to them, "I have seen the Lord!"



To obtain the plenary indulgence, the faithful must visit with devotion a statue of Our Lady of Fatima solemnly exposed for public veneration in any church on the 13th of each month from May through October this year. There they shall devoutly participate in some celebration or prayer in honor of the Virgin Mary, recite the Creed, pray an Our Father, and invoke Our Lady of Fatima. Those unable to travel to a church due to age. illness, or other serious cause may pray before a statue of Our Lady of Fatima in their homes. The ordinary conditions for a plenary indulgence must also be fulfilled: be in a state of grace, receive Holy Communion, sacramentally confess sins (within 20 days), be completely detached from all sin, and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis (suggested: an Our Father and a Hail Mary.) JOIN US after all the Masses on Sunday, August 13th, on the right side of the church where our statue of Our Lady of Fatima is displayed, as we offer our prayers to God and honor Mary. To help you obtain the indulgence, additional confession times (TBD) will be available.
