

#### From Fr. Valery, SMA My Experience with Ebola, part 2

At this time, one of our confreres, Fr. David, was on holiday in Ghana. He went in the month of June thinking that he would come back by September. Due to the ban on flights, he could not come back. By the end of June, our superiors in Rome asked us to leave Sierra Leone. I answered them: "I am not." The reason is that if I went out I would not have come back to Sierra Leone and say: "God is Good, all the time," to the people. Also, I am African and Togolese which is nearby in West Africa. Ebola can reach there. Fr. Patrickson and I discussed the response we could give concerning this situation. We agreed to use our monthly allocation to get at least some water to the people who are in difficult condition. We started to give packaged water. On arrival at the guarantined house, we found the people to be in a pathetic situation, so we brought some bags of rice to give them. Meanwhile one of the friends of Fr. Patrickson in "Jesus Youth," located in India, volunteered to donate more than his one month's salary for feeding the hungry in quarantined homes. This inspired us to make an appeal to our friends all over the world through Facebook. This brought us a great deal of success.

The unit of the Gulf of Guinea [SMA] appealed to all her members and forwarded their support to us through Rome. We then made an appeal to all the units. We are grateful to the units for their positive response. The continuous encouragement of the SMA, OLA, Friends of SMA, Jesus Youth, Parishes and our friends and family made us more able to help in this time of crisis.

We kept a close watch of all the Ebola outbreaks in and around our area. When there is a delay in supply of food, we reached out and gave food items to this area. When we go with food to these places, we find sick people in their houses. Until the end of November, 2014, the management of Ebola was not organized. There were not enough ambulances to respond to the crisis situation. This moved us to another step in Ebola Response. We came forward to take the patients to the Ebola Centers. At this time we started the habit of keeping a container with concentrated [0.5%] Chlorine solution at the back of the car always. There was a time when the people in a village called Campbell Town, took two of their patients in a wheel barrow to the Ebola Center. The ambulance was not able to reach them. We picked the patients from the wheel barrow and disinfected also all those who pushed the wheel barrow and

accompanied them by washing them with Chlorine [0.5% strength].

When we took the patients to the Ebola Centers, we were often rejected due to lack of space in the centers. There were times we would move from one center to another in search of space. There was a day when we picked four patients from the same family, (Father, Mother, Daughter and Son) on the main road since they were driven out by the villagers. We travelled to four Ebola Centers that were available in our district; but were rejected due to lack of space. At the end we decided to leave the patients outside the hospital and came back with a "bitter heart". Later, we were informed that they were taken in for treatment. Three of them died except the father who is an Ebola survivor.

We familiarized ourselves with the neighboring Ebola Care Center. We were able to check the number of available beds in the Center by calling on the one in charge, thus making the process easier to take the patients. When there is a delay in the delivery of food items to this Center, we come forward to provide food and water. We also provided five beds for the Center.

An Opportunity to Obtain an Indulgence... Under the mandate of Pope Francis, the Church's centennial celebration of Our Lady of Fatima provides a special opportunity to receive a plenary indulgence from Nov. 27, 2016 to Nov. 26, 2017. The Catechism of the

Catholic Church (CCC) defines INDULGENCE as "the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sin whose guilt has already been forgiven. A properly disposed member of the Christian faithful can obtain an indulgence under prescribed conditions with the help of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints. An indulgence is partial if it removes part of the temporal punishment due to sin or plenary if it removes all punishment." The language in the definition that appears in the U. S. Catholic Catechism for Adults is more user friendly: "The remission of temporal punishment due to sin, granted to the faithful who recite specified prayers, visit a specified place of pilgrimage, or engage in a specified act of charity: punishment is remitted through the power of the Church and in the mutual exchange of spiritual goods, particularly the merits of Christ and the saints." For more information, do an internet search of the name of either catechism, and then select www.usccb.org where you will be able to view them on-line. Both catechisms are also available for purchase online and at bookstores. Following the Masses this weekend, we invite you to gather in front of the Fatima statue to prav together the prayers for the Fatima Indulgence. One of our parishioners has graciously prepared a worship aid for all to use.


