My Experience with Ebola -- Fr. Valery, SMA
On one occasion at the Ebola Center there was a girl (Mabinti) of about four years of age. Her parents had died of Ebola. She was sick, and was taken to the Center. Fortunately

she was Ebola negative; but those in the Center did not know where to send her. There was no family to take her; even the extended family was not ready to take her. We came forward to take her to our house. Even now she is with us. We are planning of making a home for the children who are orphaned due to Ebola.

The youth of the community came to us, on their own, and expressed their desire to do their part in the fight against Ebola. We sought the support of Kwama Community Development Program [KCDP], in carrying out a seminar for the youth and encouraged the youth to go to 34 villages and inform each household of the presence and danger of Ebola and of the strict requirement for all members of every family to comply with sanitation protocols. 103 youth joined this venture.

In view of responding to the need for more beds for the Ebola patients, in collaboration with the Shepherd's Hospice, we planned and established a Community based Ebola Care Center. We received a great support from the Archbishop, Caritas - Freetown, Salesians, Xaverians and the local community. We ran the center with 20 trained nurses and 34 voluntary health workers. We operated a short time for more than one month. As the number of cases comes down and many of the centers are without patients, we decided to close down the Ebola Care Center and to plan for other health issues that come to our attention.

Now with the help of our Community Chairman, Mr. Clement Kanu, we have opened a Home for the children who lost their parents to Ebola. Though there are many children who need attention, we took only the most abandoned ones. When there are some relatives to care for them, we encourage them to care for the children. With the help of other organizations we try to assist them in providing food and other necessary things. At present we have eight children in our Home ranging from the age of 7 to 15 years. It is time for us to think of the Post Ebola Crisis. We want to help these children who are orphans of Ebola and also to build a Shrine to Our Lady of Healing. This is a huge undertaking. I hope for your supports and prayers. May Our Lady of Healing be our strength and support!

Thanks very much. God is Good, all the time, and all the time God is Good!



So—thank you to our faithful "regular" donors for the non-






