When praying with this passage from Matthew, it stood out that "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" poses a question that is different from "Who do you say that I am?" Jesus asks the first question as though someone today might seek the results of an opinion poll. The disciples have immediate responses from readily accessible information three distinct names and a category that could be defined as "other." When Jesus asks the second question, the personal question, the one with the YOU in it—the only reply is from Simon Peter, and he gets it right! If you and I were among that group of disciples, without the benefit of hindsight, how would we have answered that question? A scene pops into my head where the other disciples avoid eye contact with Jesus, perhaps hoping that the teacher will not call on them! We have countless opportunities to recognize "the Christ, the Son of the living God" in our personal prayer and in our words and actions-not just in church but in every word and deed, in every interaction with the people we meet. Now more than ever, we are called to generous-and even courageous—as we bring the Good News of Jesus Christ, the Son of the Living God, into our world.

August 27—Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary
Time: Like Peter in today's Gospel, we can find
that when we open our eyes to see, our ears to
hear and our hearts to experience Jesus'
presence in our daily lives, God reveals himself

As most of you are aware, St. Francis of Assisi School is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc. (NEASC). Accreditation has two purposes: quality assurance and school improvement. Our school was last evaluated for accreditation during the spring of 2008, and another evaluation is scheduled for April 29 – May 3, 2018.

Last school year, we began the 18-month process of preparing for our upcoming visit by undergoing a structured self-study, that examines every aspect of school life, assesses compliance with the NEASC Standards, and sets goals for school improvement.

School will begin on Wednesday, September 6th for students in grades 1 – 8. The first few days (Wednesday - Friday), will be early dismissal days at 11:30 a.m., with faculty meetings and professional development opportunities in the afternoons. Our pre-kindergarten and kindergarten programs will begin on Monday, September 11th.


