

Poor Peter... Last week, after he named Jesus as "The Christ, the Son of the Living God," Jesus said to him, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father." This week, after hearing Jesus



describe the suffering that awaits him in Jerusalem, Peter says, "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you."

What is Peter thinking here? That the Messiah will display his power in Jerusalem? That the disciples will defend and fight for Jesus? That they should change course and not go to Jerusalem? Peter's concern for his Master, his friend, is most genuine. Can you imagine how the words spoken by Jesus must have stung? "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are not thinking as God does but as human beings do." At the beginning of his ministry. Jesus withstood the temptations of Satan. And now, toward its end, even knowing what awaits him, Jesus stands firm. Praying with this, it occurs to me that Jesus continues to include Peter. "Get behind me" becomes "I lead, you follow." "You are not thinking as God does but as human beings do." Does Jesus think that Peter is capable of thinking as God does? When we make a deliberate choice to let Jesus lead us, are we capable of "thinking as God does?"



September 3—Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: Today, we hear Jesus say to us, "For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." The challenge is to let go so God can lead

us. Have you considered answering the call to help serve the poor by joining the Society of St. Vincent de Paul?


BCAM-TV. This is a great opportunity to offer your services as a volunteer and to provide a connection between our parish and those who are unable to join us for Mass.




