Today's Gospel from St. Matthew often evokes the response, "That's not fair!" How often have we said that? I remember saying it as a child, hearing it from our daughters, and now hearing it from the grandchildren—often over what we, as adults, would consider trivial matters. But what about when WE say or think, "That's not fair!" as a response to our own situation or that of someone else? "That's not fair!" usually indicates that we are angry with ourselves, with others, or with God when we end up on the wrong side of the coin toss or with the short straw. God, (aka the owner of the vineyard) offers eternal life to all people—even those who do not measure up to OUR definitions of worthiness!

The Old Testament reading reminds us that we mortals cannot contain God by our images and expectations of the Almighty: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways," says the LORD. "As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts." Jesus asks us, "Are you envious because I am generous?" If we take seriously our call to be imitators of Christ, let us put aside our envy and respond to the many opportunities we have each day to respond with generosity.


