


From the desk of the Pastoral Associate Mrs. Línda Muldoon




Bible Study... Celia Sirois of CHRISM presents "Come Holy Spirit" on Tuesdays from 7-8:30PM through **November 14**. This course,

Veteran's Outreach – Ms. Michelle Christy, the Recreation Director of Grove Manor in Braintree reached out to SFA in preparation for their upcoming Annual Veteran's Recognition. There are approximately 30 WWII Veterans that reside at this assisted living facility. Our students were asked to draw pictures, make cards, or write a letter in giving thanks to these veterans who served our country.

SFA Celebrates Veterans Day with America's White Table—By tradition, branches of the U.S. military set "America's White Table" for dinner on Veterans Day in remembrance of all veterans. This year for Veterans Day, Saint Francis classes will set two White Tables to honor all veterans. One will be set in the school lobby and another will be set in the school cafeteria. Classes will be reading a story written by Margot Theis Raven called America's White Table which shares the details of the White Table tradition. Classes will be discussing the sacrifices veterans made while serving in wars, such as missing the chance to attend college and leaving their families.



Each item on the table has a specific meaning.

- ◆ A white candle symbolizes peace.
- A white cloth honors a soldier's pure heart when our country calls him/her to duty.
- A **slice of lemon** shows a captive soldier's bitter fate.
- Grains of salt symbolize the tears of waiting families.
- Empty chair represents the missing soldiers.
- A turned over glass stands for the meal that won't be eaten.
- The black napkin signifies the sorrow of captivity.
- A red rose represents the hope that all missing soldiers will return.

Also in observance of Veterans Day, SFA will also be sponsoring a red, white, and blue dress down day (optional) on Thursday, November 9th. We will be collecting \$1.00 from students to donate to the Wounded Warrior Project. The mission of the Wounded Warrior Project is to foster service members in our nation, raise awareness of the needs of injured service members, and help injured service members aid and assist each other.
