The Solemnity we celebrate today as the Church's liturgical year draws to a close is that of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. 60 Minutes recently had a segment on the Voyager I and II spacecrafts that, although launched decades ago, continue to send to NASA information from the far outskirts of our galaxy. The images showed our planet as the tiniest of dots! They also revealed the likely presence of water (life?) on some of the other planets and moons. The visuals were beautiful and humbling. And to think that our galaxy is just one of we don't even know how many in the universe places the vastness and the grandeur into even more perspective when we worship Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

In addition to the amazing science that continues to power them, there is warmth and humanity to the information -gathering mission of the Voyagers. Aboard each spacecraft are the "Voyager Golden Records" that (thank you, Wikipedia) "contain sounds and images selected to portray the diversity of life and culture on Earth, and are intended for any intelligent extraterrestrial life form, or for future humans, who may find them. Those records are considered as a sort of a time capsule." Carl Sagan noted that "The spacecraft will be encountered and the record played only if there are advanced space-faring civilizations in interstellar space. but the launching of this bottle into the cosmic ocean says something very hopeful about life on this planet." Hopeful. "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want." In the midst of the enormity of his Universe, Christ the King is the Good Shepherd who cares for each and every one of us, in each and every moment of our lives.

November 26—Christ the King: Today as we celebrate Christ the King, we hear Jesus say: "...whatever you did for one of the least brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Knowing that we find the face of Christ in the


