

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph... Think about the last time that you took a good look at your family and thought, "We are holy" or at yourself and thought "I am holy." I have never met anyone who, when asked to describe him/herself, mentions "holy" as an

attribute. Yet—so we are. By virtue of our baptism, we are children of God and siblings of Jesus Christ; yet many of us dwell in our unworthiness and our brokenness. In the sacrament of penance, we can shed the unholy stuff we carry with us and begin anew. Every time we receive Jesus in the Eucharist we become, like Mary, the "Theotokos," the God-bearer. Caryll Houselander, a Catholic laywoman wrote, "Only Christ-bearers can restore the world to life and give humanity back the vitality of love." As we make our New Year's Re-soulutions, let us remember that we are holy, and holy is his name. In 2018, let us be Christ-bearers—in our hearts, in our words, and in our actions. 
Witness to Life Pilgrimage: January 18-20, 2018.


