

My brothers and sisters,

SOME WINTER NOTES/REMINDERS

All of the following come from my belief in you as mature dedicated Catholic people. I trust you to make good, sensible decisions out of your own devotion and charity toward one another.

First, **SNOW**. We do not cancel Mass for any weather. Sometimes the governor will restrict travel with a State of Emergency or other officials will offer requests or guidelines regarding travel or parking. These should be respected but will not result in the cancellation of Mass. If it snows on a day when a family has requested a Mass intention we will be happy to reschedule to a different day (to the extent possible).

Second, **INFLUZENZA**. This year the "flu shot" is not as helpful as in other years and there is also a rise in reported cases of the virus in this area. This often happens in Winter. Please use extra care if you know (or even suspect) that you are sick.

The one change I will make at both parishes is that we will suspend the distribution of Our Lord's Blood at Sunday and Daily Masses until the flu recedes (usually in April or May). The exceptions here will be on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Easter Sunday and the Octave of Easter/ Divine Mercy Sunday.

If anyone needs to receive from the chalice for health reasons (Celiac disease) we will, of course, accommodate those needs.

Last, **OTHER ILLNESS** concerns. Winter can bring a rise in viral and other illnesses as well. For your consideration:

- Please stay home. Illness is **ALWAYS** an acceptable reason not to attend Mass.
- Some people refrain from using the <u>Holy</u> <u>Water</u> when entering/exiting the church. We will not be emptying the fonts.
- The <u>Sign of Peace</u> is customarily marked with a handshake. A wave, nod, or any other kind gesture is acceptable.
- While reception of Holy Communion on the tongue is <u>always</u> acceptable, if you are conscious of being sick it may be appropriate to receive in the hand for a brief time.

The Jesus in Mark's gospel is an action figure. Although the briefest of the four gospels, Mark's writing contains the most activity on the part of Jesus. His Jesus is always on the move, a man on a mission. In today's passage, Jesus recruits four of his twelve Apostles. Not bad for a day's work! The words, "Then he called them," refer to James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother, John. They also refer to us! God calls out to us in so many ways with opportunities to follow him during the course of our days. Sometimes God calls to us "from the outside" in the beauty of creation, in the presence of others in our lives, in the words of Sacred Scripture, in a stanza from for a poem, or in a musical composition. And sometimes, God calls to us "from the inside" in a soft whisper to our hearts, in a gentle tap on our shoulders, or in the "thunk" of a necessary wake-up call. May God help us all to find the time and the availability to listen for his call and to respond to it.

January 21--Third Sunday in Ordinary Time:

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus says: "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." As disciples, we are called to continue God's work



on earth. Taking care of God's poor is indeed living gospel values. Have you considered answering the call to serve the poor by joining the Society of St. Vincent de Paul?

Any baptized adult who has received First Communion but who has postponed the reception of Confirmation is invited to attend. Please note that the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary to be a godparent at baptism and to serve in church ministry. This sacrament is also highly recommended for those preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage.

***A baptized Catholic, if married, is expected to be validly married in the Church prior to receiving Confirmation. Any questions regarding marriages, please consult your parish priest prior to registering

What will the course be like?

The course will introduce the adult learner to major aspects of the Catholic faith through the study of the Mass which includes reflection on the sacraments, the Creed, prayer and the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit essential to live the Christian life. The five weeks will be a chance to ask questions and move forward in faith. Please note attendance at the 5pm Mass is part of the class experience.

- Visits to the Sick and Homebound... If you or someone you know cannot attend Mass due to surgery, illness or infirmity, you can request a Communion visit. Our staff and trained home visitors are available and willing to come to you. Please call the parish office for more information.
- **Parish Prayer Line...** To be placed (or to pray) on the parish prayer line, please call the parish office.
- **Military Service...** If someone you know is newly deployed and you would like their info to appear on the board, please call or email the parish office. Thank you.
- RCIA is the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. It begins with a time to ask your questions and discern whether God is calling you to something more. Are you interested in becoming Catholic? Maybe you were baptized but missed the opportunity to receive your first holy communion or be confirmed. Maybe you have questions about our faith. You can reach out to a member of our staff at any time by contacting the parish office or join us for an inquiry session, soon to be scheduled. If the words above do not resonate with you, please pass them along to someone you know who may be interested. God works through us, especially when we pay attention.







Mass for Prayer and Penance


