



My brothers and sisters,

And so we enter HOLY WEEK:

Today is **Palm Sunday.** We commemorate two central events: the Solemn Entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem and the Passion of Jesus (this year according to St. Luke).

Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week are sacred days when we prepare ourselves for Easter.

On **Holy Thursday** the only Mass is the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. This Mass begins the Church's Sacred Triduum—3 days seen and taken as one.

From Holy Thursday night through Sunday's festivities is a time when we focus on Christ alone.

Good Friday commemorates the death of Jesus while looking past the Cross to the Tomb. Services are at 3:00PM and 7:00 PM at St. Francis, and at 3:00 PM St. Clare's. It is a day of abstinence from meat for all Catholics 14 and over. It is a day of fast for all Catholics age 18-59 inclusive (one main meal only, no eating between meals, 2 other meals may be taken to sustain strength, but those combined will not be more than the main meal).

Holy Saturday is a day of restful preparation. The Sacraments (other than Confession and Last Rites) are not celebrated.

Easter Sunday is the solemn celebration of the Lord's Resurrection. It is, thus, the preeminent Christian Feast.

On behalf of the priests, Deacons Mike Cavanaugh, Chuck Ruoff and Joe MacDonald and the staff of both parishes please know of our prayers and best wishes for a blessed Holy Week, Triduum and Easter to you and yours, Happy Easter! Fr. Paul Clifford




