



From the desk of the Pastoral Associate Mrs. Linda Muldoon

Towardness... is a word I learned this week while searching for a particular type of prayer for Pentecost. Although those who followed the directive of Jesus to "stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high" received the Holy Spirit on that first Pentecost, we are already recipients of that gift! By our baptism, our confirmation, and our participation in the sacraments of penance and Eucharist, the Holy Spirit dwells within us. It is up to us to seek and to animate that presence. Fr. Simeon, of St. Joseph's Abbey, Spencer, MA in this month's Magnificat expressed it beautifully (emphasis mine):

Remaining in Jesus' Love

Having created us without having had to, and in his own image to boot, he, infinitely superior, proceeds to become the servant of us, the inferior. In the transposition of these meanings to God, we see how needy man is of something that this world cannot provide.

What a paradox it is that human loves alone are not enough for man!

The very secret at the center of human nature is this dynamic **towardness** continually reaching out for God. The human capacity for God is not a matter of choice, an option for those among us who happen to be mystically inclined. The human instinct that tends toward God in the manner of a photosensitive plant striving toward the light is quite simply the deepest secret and motor-force of our human nature. We cannot be happy without moving toward the God whose image and likeness we bear at the center of our being. Our heart knows this even when other parts of us would persuade us otherwise.

However, our understanding of what divine love is can be neither a simple projection of our own needs nor a rational conclusion reached from certain premises. To know to the extent possible to us on the earth what **agape** is at its depths, we can go to only one source: Jesus Christ, the living Word and the incarnate Love of the Father.

For me, emerging from the winter doldrums and feeling the warmth of the sun illustrates **towardness**—as do the flowers as they bend in the direction of the sun—reminders for sure that we are indeed wired for God.
